Mr. Bowe joined APL in 1987 as Director – Service Development in Oakland, Ca. In 1988, he moved to APL's Asia-Middle East headquarters in Hong Kong as Director – Logistics for Asia and Middle East.

In 1991, he was appointed Managing Director for Middle East, Pakistan, India and Sri Lanka based in Dubai, United Arab Emirates. During his six years in Dubai, APL grew its business substantially, extending regular liner services throughout the region in response to growing customer demand.

In 1997 Mr. Bowe was named Vice-President, Worldwide Logistics and returned to Oakland. In early 1998 he moved to Singapore to become Vice-President – Liner Planning, which included responsibility for APL's worldwide Alliance Management.

Mr. Bowe returned to Hong Kong in 2001 as Vice-President and Managing Director in Hong Kong and South China, responsible for general management of APL's liner business in Hong Kong and the rapidly expanding South China provinces of Guangdong (including Shenzhen and the Pearl River Delta), Fujian, Yunnan, Guangxi and Hunan.

On June 1, 2004 Mr. Bowe was named President - Americas, based in Oakland. In this position, he is responsible for APL and APL Logistics business in North America, Mexico, and Central and South America. Mr. Bowe currently serves on the Board of the Pacific Maritime Association, the Intermodal Transportation Institute at the University of Denver, and the Oakland Museum. He is also a member of the National Academy of Sciences' Transportation Research Board in Washington, D.C., and he was recently appointed to the Goods Movement and International Trade Advisory Committee of the California Commission for Economic Development by California's Lieutenant Governor John Garamendi.
